BIBLICAL QUOTES IN THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE CAPITOL



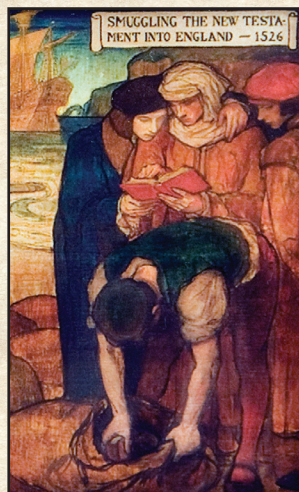
Pennsylvania's history and heritage is rooted in religious significance. From William Penn's own vision and statement of establishing a Holy Experiment, to the first laws proposed by the General Assembly, to the first section of the first Constitution, the Charter of Privileges, entitled the freedom of conscience, our founders based their way of life on religious convictions.

In 1751, upon the 50th Anniversary of the Charter of Privileges, the Speaker of the Pennsylvania House commissioned a bell to be cast with an inscription from the Bible, which later, during the abolitionist movement was adopted as an important symbol - the Liberty Bell. That symbol is now probably the most important symbol of our nation; of America's liberty. The verse reads, "Proclaim liberty throughout all the land and unto all the inhabitants thereof," Leviticus 25:10.

Today's beautiful State Capitol Building is filled with Biblical quotations and religious references on its walls and ceilings. The following are the direct quotations in some of the rooms with the Biblical references noted.

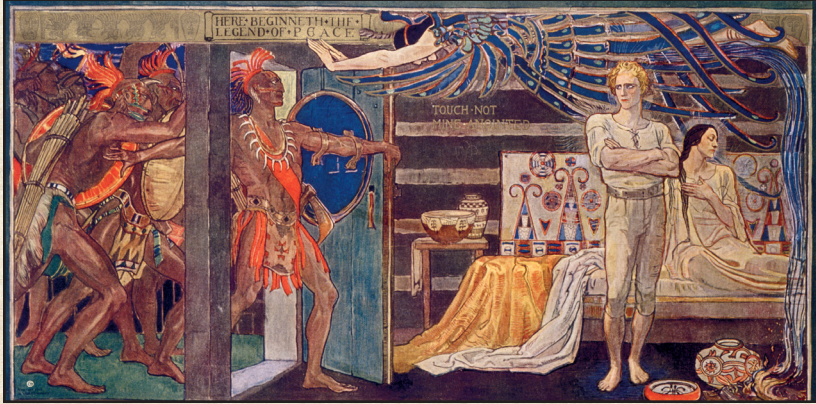

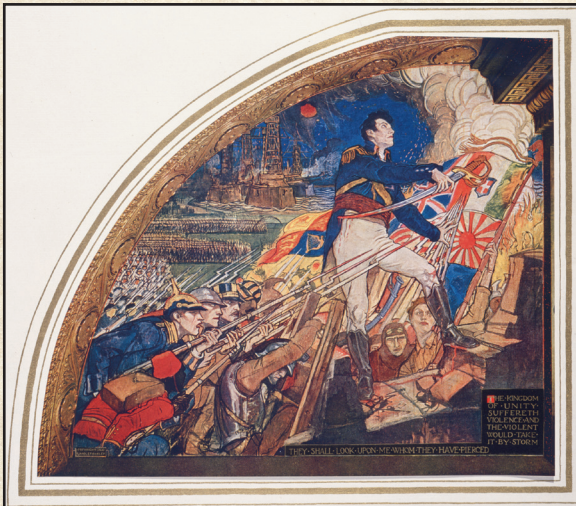

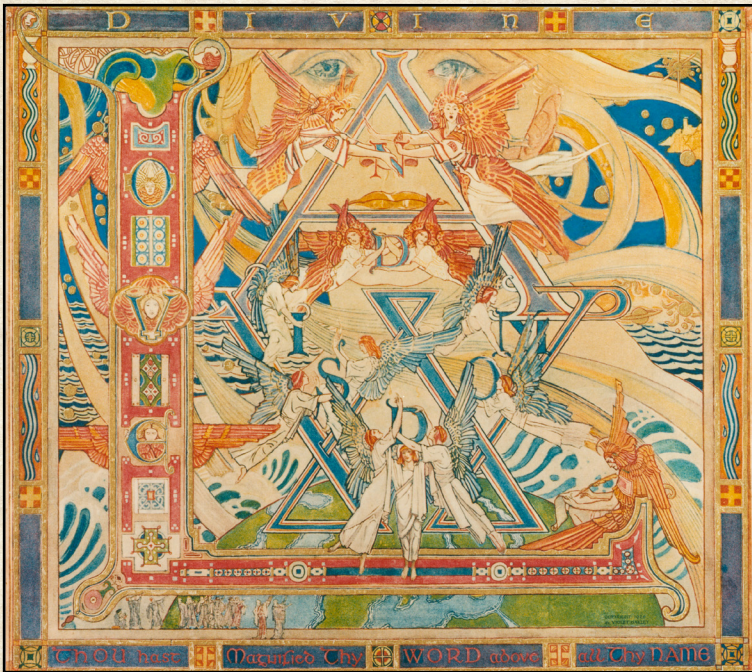

VIOLET OAKLEY (1874-1961)



Violet Oakley was born into a family of artistic tradition. Oakley's formal artistic education was rather sporadic. Although she studied at the Arts Student League in Philadelphia, and at various institutions abroad during summer trips, the bulk of her training came from copying works of the old masters on her own.

The year 1896 was a landmark in Oakley's early career. Her family moved to Philadelphia, where she soon entered Howard Pyle's illustration class at Drexel Institute. She flourished under Pyle's tutelage and soon became one of America's most popular illustrators, designing covers for Century Magazine, Collier's Illustrated Weekly, Everybody's Magazine, St. Nicholas and Woman's Home Companion. At the same time, she also gained a reputation as a talented designer of stained glass.

In 1902, Oakley was asked by the Capital architect to paint thirteen murals for the Governor's Reception Room. Huston believed that his choice of Oakley would "act as an encouragement of women and the State." In fact, the Harrisburg project signified a milestone in the history of American art, for it was the largest public commission given to a woman in the country up to that time. In addition, it allowed Oakley to transcend the conventional roles of women painters as either portrait or genre painters, and to pursue a successful career in the prestigious, but overwhelmingly masculine, field of mural decoration.

Throughout her work on the Governor's Reception Room, Oakley received much publicity. The Harrisburg murals won her the Gold Medal of Honor from the Pennsylvania Academy of Fine Arts in 1905, making her the first woman to receive this distinction.

After the death of Edwin Austin Abbey in 1911, she obtained the commission to complete the contract for the Senate Chamber and Supreme Court. Oakley painted a total of 43 murals for the Capitol Building.

Not only was Violet Oakley a talented artist, she was also a social activist involved in the women's suffrage movement, and totally devoted to the ideals of international government and world peace. In fact, when the United States refused to join the League of Nations in 1927, Oakley went to Geneva herself as a self-appointed ambassador.

Through her three cycles of visionary murals in the Pennsylvania State Capitol, Oakley sought to express her desire and hope for “world peace, equal rights, and faith in the work of unification of the Peoples of the Earth.” Violet Oakley’s three series of murals can be seen in the following locations:

Governor’s Reception Room -

“The Founding of the State of Liberty Spiritual” (completed 1906)

Senate Chamber -

“The Creation and Preservation of the Union” (completed 1920)

Supreme Court Chamber -

“The Opening of the Book of Law” (completed 1927)



EDWIN AUSTIN ABBEY (1852-1911)



Edwin Austin Abbey was one of the most celebrated artists of his day. Born in Philadelphia, he briefly studied art at the Pennsylvania Academy under Christian Schuessele. Before he was twenty years old, he was enjoying a brilliant career as an illustrator of poetry and drama for Harper's Weekly. Then in the late 1870s, Abbey left America for England to pursue a career as a large-scale history painter. While in England, he was elected to the Royal Academy and admitted to the elite artistic circle of the Pre-Raphaelites.

As a result of his growing reputation at home, as well as abroad, Abbey was invited by American sculptor Auguste saint-Gaudens in 1890 to undertake what would be his most famous commission – the mural cycle The Quest for the Holy Grail for the McKim, Mead and White Boston Public Library, completed in 1901.

When Abbey was given his largest commission in 1902 to decorate the Rotunda, House and Senate chambers, and the supreme and Superior court Room in the Pennsylvania State Capitol, the artist knew that this monumental project inaugurated a new phase in his career. Thus he turned all of his energies to this project, which he saw as his personal tribute to Pennsylvania and its history.

Abbey executed the Capitol murals in his studio in England. By the spring of 1908, all murals for the Rotunda were complete. They were exhibited at the University of London, where they received the highest acclaim. King Edward VII himself expressed regret that these magnificent paintings were leaving England. By 1909, the murals for the Capitol Rotunda had been shipped to Harrisburg and were placed at the collar of the dome. Four large circular canvases, fourteen feet in circumference, were installed in the pendentives. The four huge crescent-shaped murals, measuring 38 feet by 22 feet, were placed in the lunettes of the Rotunda.

When Abbey died suddenly in 1911, his widow administered the completion and installation of the House murals. The artist had completed three works for the House: **The Apotheosis of Pennsylvania (page 11)**, Penn's Treaty, and The Hours, the latter of which is located on the ceiling. The

Reading of the Declaration of Independence for the House Chamber had been partially completed. This painting was finished by Ernest Board, a member of Abbey's studio, under the supervision of John Singer Sargent. Only one mural had been executed for the Senate Chamber entitled The Camp of the American Army at Valley Forge, February 1778. This painting, completed in 1910, had originally been placed in the Senate Chamber. As a result of Abbey's untimely death, it was removed and relocated onto a north wall in the rear of the House of Representatives' Chamber where it remains today.

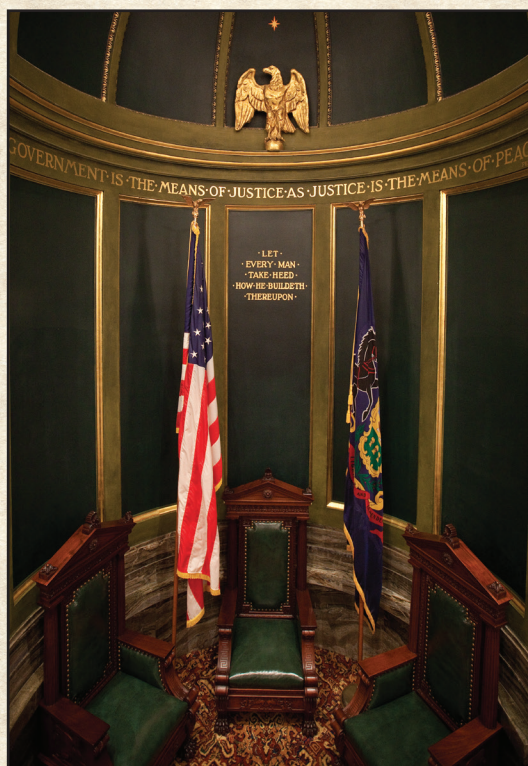
