## ABOUT THE MEMORIAL

The Memorial – a central location for ceremony and contemplation, education and commemoration – stands in lasting tribute to those who served our state and nation in times of war and peace. The Memorial design is intended to evoke “the ruins of a war-torn building centered in a land of solemnity”. Its architecture is peaceful and harmonious, containing the elements of air, land and water – representative of the battlefields where our veterans fought for our freedom.

A tomb for all fallen soldiers, known or unknown, is strategically placed, mindful of the sacrifices shared by veterans in the cause of freedom.

The Memorial serves as an active living memorial to the ideals and principles for which veterans have served, battled and died.
