About the Veterans' Trust Fund:

The Veterans' Trust Fund (VTF) was established in 2012 by Pennsylvania law (51 Pa. C. S. § 1721). The VTF is a special, non-lapsing fund of the Pennsylvania State Treasury. The Pennsylvania Department of Military and Veterans Affairs is authorized to solicit and accept donations to the VTF on behalf of the Commonwealth.

For tax purposes, donations to the Veterans' Trust Fund are considered "charitable contributions." The definition of "charitable contributions" in the Internal Revenue Code (26 USC §170(c)(1)) includes contributions to state governments that are used for public purposes. A gift or donation to the VTF is tax deductible just like, and to the same extent as, any charitable contribution. See IRS Publication 526 (Charitable Contributions).

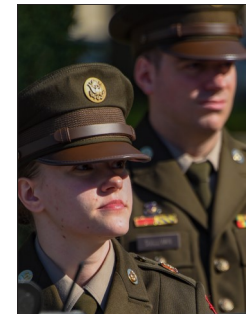

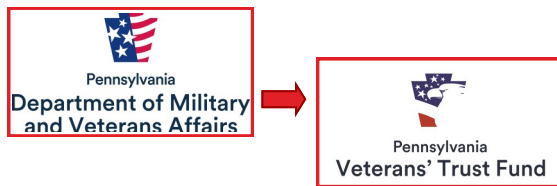

The Veterans' Trust Fund (VTF), administered by the Pennsylvania Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (DMVA), provides funding to Pennsylvania veterans and their families. The VTF issues competitive grants to statewide charitable organizations that assist veterans, veterans service organizations and county directors of veterans affairs, as well as funds temporary assistance requests to veterans needing shelter and help with the necessities of living.



Sources of Funds

Funding for the Veterans' Trust Fund was established by law (51 Pa.C.S. § 1721) and it includes:

- Transfer of funds after the sale of the former Scotland School for Veterans' Children
- Proceeds from the voluntary \$5 or \$10 donations from people applying for or renewing their Pennsylvania driver's license or photo ID and renewing motor vehicle registrations
- Proceeds from the sale of the "Honoring Our Veterans" standard and motorcycle license plates
- Grants, gifts and donations from a person, business, or governmental entity
- Money appropriated to the fund

How can you help?

There are several ways that Pennsylvanians can donate to the VTF:

- The next time you apply for or renew your Pennsylvania driver's license or photo ID or renew your motor vehicle registration, you will have an opportunity to make a \$5 or \$10 tax-deductible contribution to the VTF. Since this donation is not part of the fee printed on your renewal application, you will need to add the donated amount to your payment. Please follow the same process if you renew via PennDOT's website.

- You don't need to be a veteran to show your support of veterans by purchasing the "Honoring Our Veterans" or the "Honoring Our Women Veterans" registration plates. The "Honoring Our Veterans" plate is available for passenger cars and light trucks up to 10,000 pounds and costs \$41. The plate is also available for motorcycles and costs \$41. The cost for "Honoring Our Women" registration plates is \$40.



- You can make a tax-deductible grant, gift or donation to the VTF.



How will Pennsylvania's veterans benefit from the VTF?

- The VTF strives to fund partnerships with charitable organizations, veterans service organizations and county directors of veterans affairs to fund improved assistance and support for PA veterans and their families. Grants from the VTF may assist veterans in obtaining federal veterans benefits and pensions earned by virtue of their service and sacrifice.

Veterans Designation on PA Driver's Licenses and Identification Cards.

- VTF funds have also been used to implement the Veterans Designation on Pennsylvania driver's license and ID cards that clearly indicates that the bearer is a veteran of the United States Armed Forces. Initial issuance, renewal or duplicate driver's license or identification card fees apply.
