Healthy Beginnings Plus Program - Healthy Beginnings Plus is Pennsylvania's effort to assist low-income, pregnant women who are eligible for Medicaid in having a positive prenatal care experience. Healthy Beginnings Plus (HBP) expands maternity services that can be reimbursed by Medicaid.

There is no application to qualify for this program. To enroll, you must:

- Be determined eligible for Medicaid.
- Be pregnant.
- Receive maternity services from one of the Healthy Beginnings Plus enrolled providers.

CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM (CHIP) DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES

CHIP - CHIP is a government-sponsored health insurance program for children up to age 19 who are uninsured and ineligible for medical assistance (Medicaid). While family income is not a factor to eligibility, families with higher incomes could pay a low monthly premium and co-pay for some services. Covered services include doctor visits, prescription drugs and immunizations.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Pennsylvania resident and U.S. citizen
- Ineligible for Medicaid or other health insurance
- Under Age 19

VACCINES FOR CHILDREN (VFC) PROGRAM DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

Vaccines for Children - VFC Program provides vaccines to children who do not have health insurance. Children who are insured but whose insurance does not cover immunizations (under insured) are also eligible to receive federally funded vaccines at public sites, including Federally Qualified Health Centers, state Health Centers and Rural Health Clinics.

PENNSYLVANIA BREAST & CERVICAL CANCER EARLY DETECTION PROGRAM (PA-BCCEDP) DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

Pennsylvania Breast & Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program (PA-BCCEDP) - This program was formally known as the Healthy Woman Program and is now known as the PA-BCCEDP which offers free breast and cervical cancer screenings such as mammograms, MRIs, Pap and HPV tests as well as follow-up tests for an abnormal screening result. Eligibility Requirements:

- Breast screening and diagnostics (Women 40–64)
- Cervical screening and diagnostics (Women 21–64)
- Have no or limited health insurance
- Have a low-to-moderate income
- Woman must live in Pennsylvania
